TO: Owners and operators of Bicycles at JNW.
RE: Use of Bicycles on Camp Property

We are very happy to see the increased use of Bicycles. It is a good way to get around and should be encouraged. Like everything else, however, it does have its problems and must have certain rules. So that Campers and Staff alike may know the policy, I wish to make the following simple rules.

1. **BICYCLE HELMETS** – Bicycle operators ***MUST*** wear a helmet at all times when operating a bike.
2. **KEEP TO THE RIGHT** – Like a car, all Bikes must keep to the right side of roads and trails.
3. **PASS ON THE LEFT** – If you are overtaking anyone or any vehicle, you must pass on the left.
4. **A BICYCLE BUILT FOR 'ONE'** – Only ONE person on a bike at one time.
5. **NO NIGHT RIDING WITHOUT ADEQUATE LIGHTS** - Walk your bike back to your camp site unless you have adequate lights to see where you are riding. This includes adequate tail light too.
6. **NO PARKING AGAINST BUILDINGS** - When you park your bike near any of the camp buildings you must use your stand or lay them down on the ground. You may park against trees or rocks but not against Buildings.
7. **A SCOUT IS THRIFTY** – Take care of your Bike, it is a piece of equipment and should not be abused.
8. **PENALTIES** - First offense will be loss of the use of your bike for one (1) twenty-four period. Second offense will be loss of your bike for one (1) week. Third offense, your bike will be sent home. No riding by offenders at camp.
9. The Mountain Bike/Sports Staff will issue bike licenses and they can be revoked if the rules are not followed.

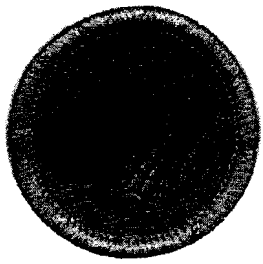

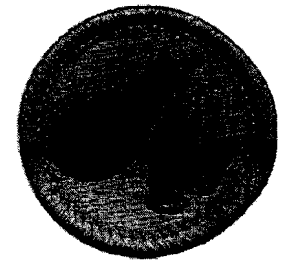

Shooting Sports



Merit badge cards and books: They are needed on Monday morning. Books can be shared between scouts in the same troop.

The program meets on Monday and Tuesday at chip's cabin. This is all program work the rest of the week it is at the range.

Because of this all scouts are encouraged to go to the range during free shoot to work on their shooting requirements.

Merit badge scouts have priority during free shoot.

If the scout can physically lift and control the shotgun safely they will be allowed to shoot. This will be at the instructors discretion.

Scouts will earn a partial in rifle or shotgun shooting even if they don't fire a shot. The class room is a joint requirement session with both rifle and shotgun.

It is recommended that 1st time campers go to first class path.

Scouts that arrive at camp with a partial and wish to complete the badge do not have to sign up for the course they can complete the badge during free shoot. They just have to identify themselves to the instructor with the blue card.

Merit badge work ends at 4:30 PM Friday, which time the ranges will be closed, in order to facilitate the range clean up and completion of blue cards so that you as a leader can have them to take home. You will receive a folder complete with the scout's targets attached to the blue card. The targets are for the scout to show his parents and to justify where in the partial they are if the can finish during off season.

Free shoot will be from 2:00PM until 4:30PM

Troop Shoot will be after dinner Mondays through Thursdays only. You will have to sign up to reserve your time. At the end of the week we will recognize the top troop from the week.

Any help from the Scout Masters on the ranges will not be turned away please talk to the instructors.
